The Tabernacle

The earthly tabernacle and later temples are modeled after God's heavenly temple. The word tabernacle means dwell. In the New Testament, the Bible teaches that Jesus dwelled or "tabernacled" among the people. Now that Jesus has ascended to heaven, He sits at the right hand of God's throne. Now believers in Jesus are the temple of the Holy Spirit. The books of Leviticus & Deuteronomy give the details of what it means to worship God His way.

Jesus: The true offering
