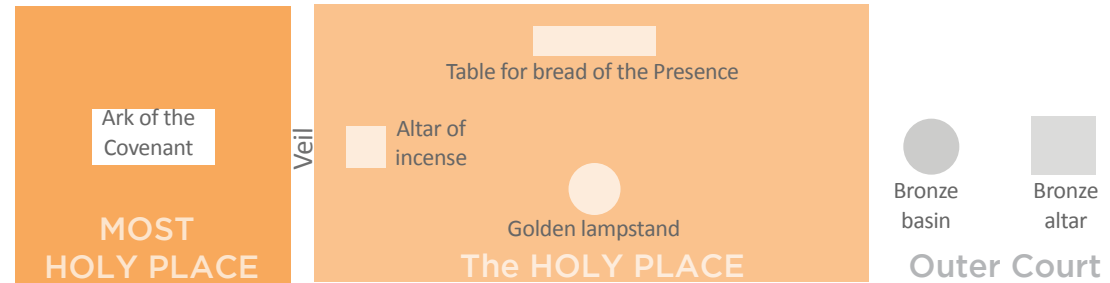


# Law

## 1 Tool: Summary Sheet

### The Tabernacle

The earthly tabernacle and later temples are modeled after God's heavenly temple. The word tabernacle means dwell. In the New Testament, the Bible teaches that Jesus dwelled or "tabernacled" among the people. Now that Jesus has ascended to heaven, He sits at the right hand of God's throne. Now believers in Jesus are the temple of the Holy Spirit. The books of Leviticus & Deuteronomy give the details of what it means to worship God His way.



### Offerings

Why	Given during times of thanksgiving, penitence, or vows	Given during times of thanksgiving, penitence, vows or first fruits	Given for thanksgiving, during a vow or for a freewill offering	For forgiveness of unintentional sin once it is realized	For sinning in the holy things of God or doing wrong to another person
How	All of an animal was burned except the skin; Intended to be expensive, but allowance was made for the poor	Fine flour or crushed grain with oil, frankincense and salt; May also be baked but must be unleavened	Fat, kidneys and liver of a ram, bull, lamb or goat is burned; The flesh of the animal is eaten	Animal is sacrificed and the blood of the animal is used to cleanse sacred items in the tabernacle; The type of animal depends on the rank of the offender	Fat & entrails of certain animals and restitution + 20% to neighbor for how the person robbed them
When	Twice daily, Sabbath, and feasts Leviticus 1; 6:8-13	Twice daily, Sabbath, and feasts Leviticus 2; 6:14-23	Feast of Weeks (Pentecost), Anytime as a thanks, vow or freewill offering Leviticus 3; 7:11-36	Special focus on the Day of Atonement, also during feasts Leviticus 4:1-5:13; 6:24-30	Anytime there was an offence in the holy things of God or stealing from a neighbor in some way Leviticus 5:14-6:7; 7:1-10

### Jesus: The true offering

For since the law has but a shadow of the good things to come instead of the true form of these realities, it can never, by the same sacrifices that are continually offered every year, make perfect those who draw near. Otherwise, would they not have ceased to be offered, since the worshipers, having once been cleansed, would no longer have any consciousness of sins? But in these sacrifices there is a reminder of sins every year. For it is impossible for the blood of bulls and goats to take away sins.

Consequently, when Christ came into the world, he said, "Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body have you prepared for me; in burnt offerings and sin offerings you have taken no pleasure. Then I said, 'Behold, I have come to do your will, O God, as it is written of me in the scroll of the book.'" Hebrews 10:1-7
